- In a few sentences, please answer the following questions:
 - o Tell us about yourself (i.e. your personal and professional goals, accomplishments, values, personality)?
 - o Why do you deserve this scholarship?
 - o What are your career goals?
 - o What activities are you involved in (please share activities, programs, or extracurricular you were involved in prior to the pandemic as well)?
 - o What are your greatest strengths and weaknesses?
 - o Who has been a role model to you and why?
 - o Tell us about a personal achievement that makes you proud?
 - o How have you served those in need? What has that experience meant to you?
 - o If you are given an opportunity to meet someone ancient or modern, who will it be and why?
 - o In what ways have you demonstrated a personal commitment to excellence?
 - o How have you served those in need and what has it meant to you?

- Please complete a 500-word reflection from the book, *Losing Ike to God and How God Comforted Us* as follows:
 - O Choose a letter that one of Ike's friends wrote to him or a story that one of his friends told about him in the book that has a special meaning to you. The letter or story should indicate a characteristic that Ike's friends saw in him, which you would like to develop within yourself. Discuss how Ike's behavior demonstrated this character trait and how you might be able to use his behavior as an inspiration to make a positive change in your own life give concrete examples of how you could implement this trait into your daily life at school and at home.
 - o What do you think about Ike's Philosophy of life as He wrote in His essay and what is Your philosophy of life?


